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



What to do:


1. Get the toothbrush and put fluoride toothpaste that is the size of a pea.
2. Start brushing your teeth from the back in circles starting from the top of your teeth and work your way to the front and don't forget to brush your gums!
3. After that brush the inside, front and outside.
4. Make sure to brush for 2 minutes, 30 seconds each quadrant.






Sound is made by Vibrations. That turn into sound waves and carried by the air. Once in the ear, sound travels through the ear canal. Then, it goes to the ear drum and hits three bones called the Hammer, Anvil and Stirrup. The three bones hit a liquid inside cochlea. Inside there are tiny hairs that send signals to the hearing nerve. Next the hearing nerve puts together the signals to understand what the sound is.



To know how sound is made and how we hear it.



Thursday 8th February 2018



1. Sound (Vibrations) travels down to the ear drum (thin piece of skin stretched tight like a drum) through the ear canal.

2. The ear drum hits middle ear bones (which are called the hammer, anvil and stirrup) into the inner ear.
3. The bones hit a liquid in the cochlea (a small, coiled tube in the inner ear).
4. The liquid moves some tiny hairs in the cochlea.
5. The tiny hairs send electrical signals to the hearing nerve in the brain.
6. The brain puts the signals together to understand the sound.
