In some cases, a customised blazer can cost up to £50 and even ties can be surprisingly costly. In addition, parents argue that they will feel pressured into ensuring uniform is washed and prepared so that their child meets the required standard of appearance. Moreover, this would be notably burdensome primarily after a long, tiring day at work.

After considering both sides of the argument, it is clear that there are very persuasive points for abolishing school uniform. However, I'm sure you will agree that wearing school uniform brings a sense of pride and belonging to a community. Yes, choosing your own clothes may be one way of expressing your personality, however, you should not only be judged by your appearance.
