Dear Parents/Carers,

Year 1 Pupils

We hope you have had a good summer break and are ready for your child to return to school on **Monday 7th September**.

Over the summer break, we have continued to work on our risk assessment to ensure we minimise risk to each year group 'bubble.' This means that children will only come into regular contact with other children in their year group. Some of the implications of this are:

- Each year group will have a different daily start and finish time so we avoid children, and collecting adults, coming into close contact.
- Each year group will have their own lunch time, this will include time for eating and playing separately from other year groups.
- We will not be having any assemblies, unless they are year group only assemblies

Your child should **arrive at 9:10 am** and **leave at 3:20 pm** using the **Pemberton Road top gate**. There will be a one way system in place and parents/carers will need to walk through the playground and leave via the lower gate on **Pemberton Road**. The scooter park will be closed and no scooters will be permitted to be left on site. Parents will not be allowed to enter the building and you will drop your child off at the school door. Due to the staggered started times, each year group bubble must be punctual in order to maintain social distancing.

There will be no KS1 breakfast club, however, we are looking into how we may be able to facilitate this in the coming weeks.

All children are expected to return to school in full school uniform. However, we know this may be difficult for some of our families. If you feel you would benefit from our donated school uniforms, please let our school office know by emailing or phoning the school office.

You are reminded that you must not send your child to school if they or another member of your household has Covid 19 symptoms. You must follow the stay at home guidance in the link below:
