On the morning, there were 4 groups of 5 schools which were randomly selected. The top two teams from each group qualified for the final group of 8 teams, to be played in the afternoon. We were fantastic! Despite being in a very tough group, we managed to finish top after playing some very exciting, high-scoring basketball. In the afternoon, we again played extremely well; unfortunately, we finished just 1 point short of qualifying for the 3rd place play-offs and finished in 5th place. This is still a brilliant result-we finished 5th out of 20 schools- especially considering the fact that most of the players have only been training for a few weeks.
