Our girls lost the first game of the group to Rhodes Avenue 1-0 but then went on to win all remaining group games to finish 2nd in their group. They qualified for the 2nd tier group in the afternoon and won 4 out of 5 games to finish top of the group and 6th out of 24 schools. The boys won 4 out of 5 games in the morning, drawing 1 and therefore qualifying for the top tier group and creating the chance to win the tournament. 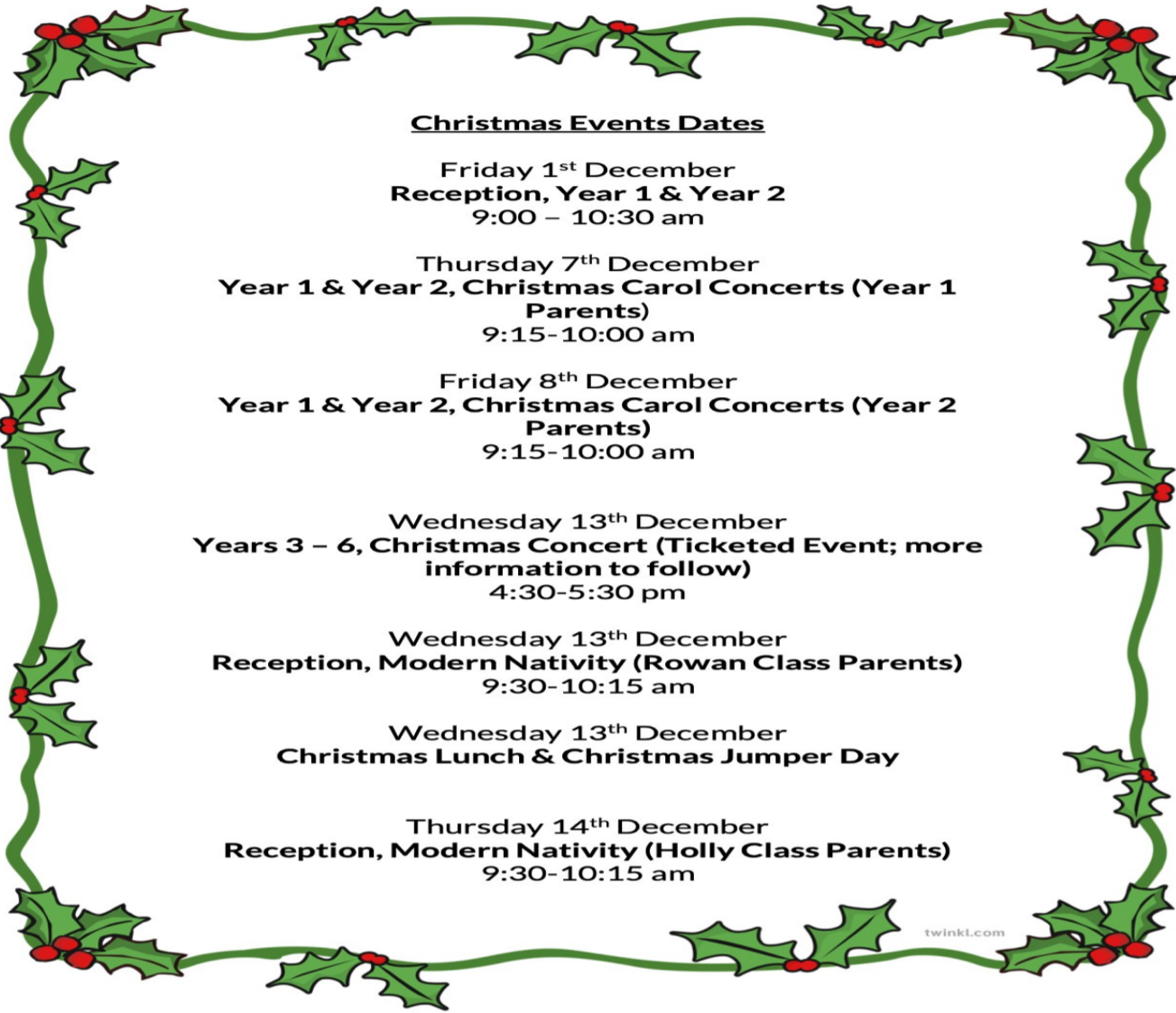


Trips

In Year 3, we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians. We studied the changes across the three kingdoms, including: the way in which pharaohs were buried; the way in which beliefs developed and spread; the development of using hieroglyphs as a means of communication; and how the ancient Egyptians perfected the technique of embalming, or mummification within the middle kingdom.

Throughout our learning, we explored many secondary sources; our visit to the British Museum allowed our children to view some of these artefacts in all of their magnificent glory! Not only were the children in awe of the obvious craftsmanship of this ancient civilisation, they also studiously engaged in specific tasks and were incredibly focused upon finding evidence from the exhibits to justify their opinions and consolidate their knowledge. 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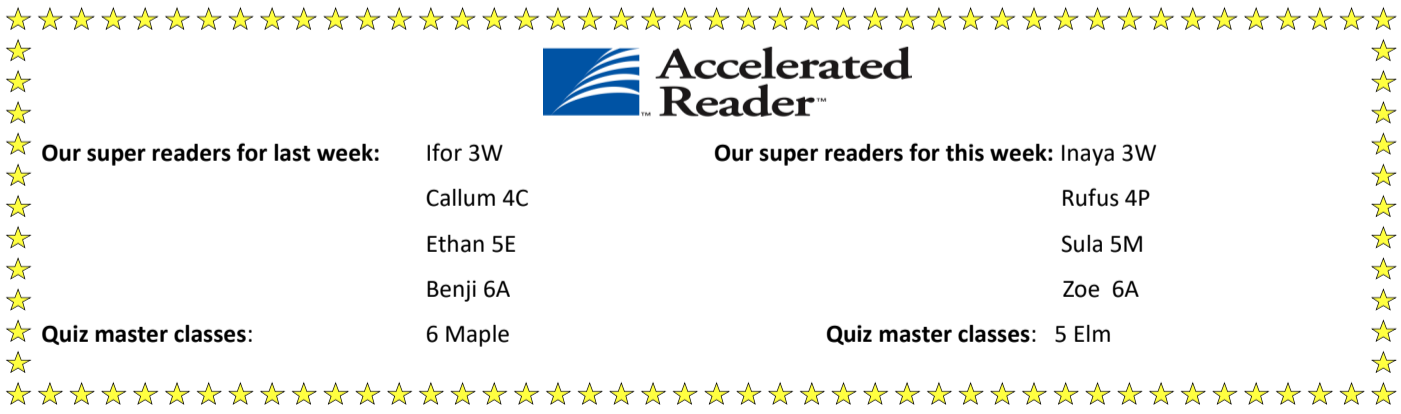
