Year 4 Roman Pavilions

In DT lessons last term year 4 explored different frame structures and testing how to make these structures stable. As part of the learning, they designed a Roman pavilion structure inspired by History lessons on the Roman Empire. Then the children combined their individual ideas to form a final design for their pavilions. First, they sketched a pavilion frame and then started building with a range of materials. Then, the children added cladding to reinforce their structures. Finally, the children added fabric to make their pavilions stand out as you can see from [the photos!](#)

Year 1 Toy Making

Year 1 have been designing a toy, suitable for a young child, that includes wheels, axles and axle holders, which will allow the wheels to move. After designing and constructing their toy, they knew they had to test their mechanisms, identifying what stops wheels from turning and finally evaluating their mechanisms thinking how they could further improve their toy and what makes them appealing to children. This year's Easter Art Competition brought a burst of colour and creativity to our school, inspired by the remarkable British-Nigerian artist Nnena Kalu. Based in London, Nnena is renowned for her large-scale, vibrant sculptures, often created using unconventional materials such as VHS tape, fabric, and clingfilm. In December 2025, she made history as the first learning disabled artist to win the prestigious Turner Prize.

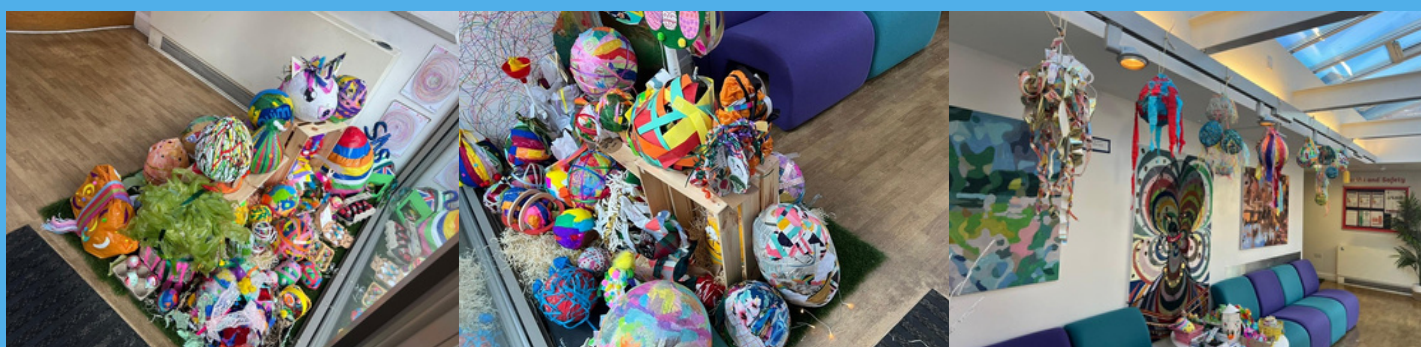
Taking inspiration from Nnena's unique artistic style, children from across the school designed and created their own imaginative 'egg' sculptures and drawings. Using techniques such as wrapping, binding, and layering reused materials, pupils explored texture, form, and colour in exciting and innovative ways.

The results were truly outstanding, with every child producing a piece full of originality and care. It was a joy to see such enthusiasm and creativity on display in our reception area.

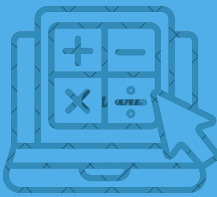
Congratulations to all of our winners, and a huge well done to every pupil who took part—your creativity made this year's competition a wonderful celebration of art and imagination.

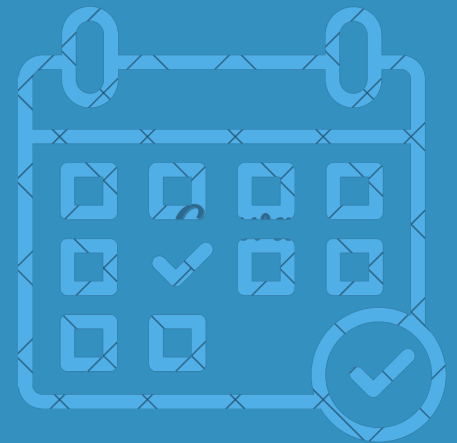
