Year 5 Cooking

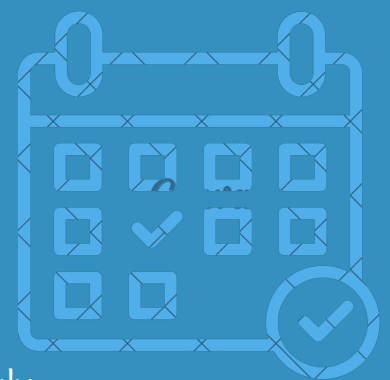
