The aim of this project is to monitor how biodiversity is changing in cities and towns, in order to better understand and protect the nature around us.

Throughout the trip, the children were required to use

their knowledge of different species and their skills of classification. They devised an investigation to answer the question, 'What is the impact of human activity on biodiversity in Hyde Park?' Using a quadrat, they compared and contrasted the biodiversity of the parade ground and the meadow within the park. Once the data was collected, they presented their result in the form of a human bar graph.
